DEVELOPMENT

- On July 3, 2013, after the box office success of the first film, Lionsgate CEO <u>Jon</u>
 <u>Feltheimer</u> confirmed that there would be a sequel to the film, with production beginning in 2014 for an unspecified release date
- In September 2014, it was confirmed that <u>Jon M. Chu</u> would replace Louis Leterrier as director
 - Louis did not want to return
- On October 2, 2014, Michael Caine confirmed in an interview that <u>Daniel Radcliffe</u> would be playing his son in the film, and that shooting is expected to begin in December in London
- The sequel was thought to be titled Now You See Me: Now You Don't, but it was announced in November 2014 that the film had changed its title to Now You See Me: The Second Act
- "But even in the pre-vis, we didn't know cardistry well enough. We had to practice before with our cardistry expert."
- For card tricks, they turned to expert Andrei Jikh
- Chief magic and mentalism consultant <u>Keith Barry</u>. Change in tonality of voices works more effectively during hypnosis.

- "It's always a challenge to shoot magic in a movie because magic really happens in person," Chu told me. "You want to know that there's no strings attached, nothing up the sleeves. So we take big efforts to make as many things practical as possible."- Jon M. Chu/Tech Crunch
- The principles of magic are "used to manipulate us every day," making the movie's Four Horsemen "the people who know the tricks and are trying to expose the idea that these tricks are everywhere. I think that's a great concept for these superheroes. But their superpower is storytelling and manipulation and psychology. I think that's very a different take on how to create justice in the world." Jon M. Chu/Tech Crunch

- On November 25, 2014, <u>Mark Ruffalo</u> posted to his Facebook that filming had begun on the sequel, as the film was shooting in <u>London</u>, England
- On March 11, 2015, shooting began in China, where filming took place in <u>Macau</u> and Macao Science Center
- Water Fall Trick- Motion after-effect (MAE) and is a phenomenon often called the 'waterfall illusion' after being spotted at a waterfall in Foyers, Scotland in 1834. It causes cells in the brain that are sensitive to a certain direction of movement to tire, which then activates the cells that respond to the opposite direction. This makes stationary objects appear to move in that opposite direction
